We had a great Aspirations Week, whereby children had a chance to consider their hopes and dreams for the future. A huge thank you to the parents who came in to talk about their jobs. Reception had a visit from a doctor. The children enjoyed trying out all of the equipment. They were all very inquisitive and had lots of questions. Hopefully we have some future doctors in the making!

Year 1 had a visit from an artist and musician named Jason. He showed some of his amazing work and spoke to the children about how he used the vibrations from music to create some of his paintings.

Year 2 had a visit from a dentist and an engineer who worked for London Underground. We learnt about the importance of keeping our teeth clean and how to become a dentist. We also found out what happens behind the scenes when we travel on the tube!

Year 3 had a very interesting visit from James Moore who is a journalist. James spoke about how he became a journalist and even showed us some of his work in the newspaper.

Main Gate

Please note that the main gate in Atherton Road will not be opened for parents until 3.20 pm each day. This is to ensure the safety of the children.

Attendance

It is important that your child attends school every day and arrives on time for the start of the school day. Children who arrive late on a regular basis disturb the whole class when they arrive late. The Government expects a minimum attendance of 96%. For January our attendance percentage was exactly 96% so we just meet their expectations. Now let us see if we can beat this figure for future months!!

Please make sure your child comes to school fully prepared for the day with everything they need for the whole day and any after school clubs. Please do not ask our very busy office staff to pass things on, especially packed lunches and PE kits. We cannot guarantee that items will be taken to class after the start of the day.

World Book Day - 5th March 2020

There will be various activities in school for World Book Week. These will include:

Children will be given a book token which can be exchanged in participating outlets when purchasing a book. 5 Big Bad Wolves(KS2) and 5 Little Red Riding Hoods(KS1) will be hidden around school for the children to find. Children who find them can collect a book from Miss Craggs during afternoon play.

Children can come to school in their pyjamas or dressed as a book character. The theme for World Book Day on 5th March will be favourite stories with an emphasis on encouraging and celebrating reading at home.

The library will be open from 3.30 until 4.15 on 5th March instead of on the Monday for parents and children.

The library will also be open from 8.25 in the morning for KS1 children and their parents to pop in for a story.

For homework on Friday 28th February the children will take home a book cover template to design their own book cover. Please encourage your child to be creative!! These designs should not be stuck in their homework books as the designs will be displayed around the school.

We may have a Book Bus visit on Thursday 11th March from the Book People, but we are unsure if this is going ahead as they have recently gone into liquidation. We will confirm by a Group Call Text as soon as we have confirmation.

There will be story telling after school on 5th March from 3.45 for all year groups. The location for each year group is as follows:

Foundation stage/nursery/early years for children accompanied by parents will be in Reception Class RM.

KS1 for children accompanied by parents will be in the library.

Lower KS2 for children accompanied by parents will be in Year 3 class 3R.

Upper KS2 will be in Year 5 class 5J. Children in Year 5 will need to be collected by an adult and Year 6 children can walk home alone if you have given written permission for them to do so.

KS1 stories in French will take place in class 1S.

KS2 stories in French will take place in class 3C.
