



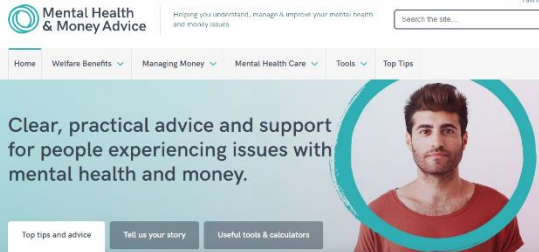

Parenting Courses On-Line

InOurPlace are delivering ‘Understanding Your Child’ on-line parenting courses, developed by the Solihull Approach. These are available free of charge to Redbridge residents. There are three different courses available covering the age range from pregnancy into childhood, some of which are in alternative languages. Each course consists of a number of modules. These can be completed at your own pace. The courses are suitable for parents, carers and grandparents and they aim to enhance family life, improving understanding of babies and children.

Upon completion, you can opt to receive a certificate. To view the courses, you will first need to register an account using your e-mail address and then use the access code **BRIDGE** to obtain free use. Article of the Week- World Day against Child Labour (Articles 24 and 33)

Article 24- Health and Health Services

Every child has the right to the best possible health. Governments must provide good quality health care, clean water, nutritious food, and a clean environment and education on health and well-being so that children can stay healthy.

Article 33- Drug Abuse

Governments must protect children from the illegal use of drugs and from being involved in the production or distribution of drugs.
