


GLADE @ A GLANCE

YEAR 5 — VIKING ADVENTURES



NSPCC NUMBER DAY




Year 1 children explored local history at Valentines Mansion. They thoroughly enjoyed their visit and explored many aspect of life in the past in Britain.



As part of their maths work, all KS2 classes had maths workshops which gave them the opportunity to apply their maths problem solving skills to different practical tasks


