


## RECEPTION — FIRST WEEK

YEAR 6 — POETRY WORKSHOPS
















#### YEAR 6 TRENCHES DAY

#### SCHOOLS FOR SUCCESS




Glade Primary has been recognised by Sadiq Khan, the mayor of London, as a school for success.




#### ROAD SAFETY WEEK


