Article of the Week 24 & 33

The Articles of the week are Articles 24 (health and health services) and 33 (drug abuse).

Every child has the right to the best possible health. Governments must provide good quality health care, clean water, nutritious food, and a clean environment and education on health and well-being so that children can stay healthy.



Governments must protect children from the illegal use of drugs and from being involved in the production or distribution of drugs. States Parties shall take all appropriate measures, including legislative, administrative social and educational measures, to protect children from the illicit use of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances as defined in the relevant international treaties, and to prevent the use of children in the illicit production and trafficking of such substances.

Picture News- Article 17

Through the weekly Picture News assembly, children learn about our world, develop independence, resilience, respect and unlock their own drive and passion for learning. The weekly Picture News is shared on our website:



Benefits of Learning a Musical Instrument- Articles 29 and 31

The most important benefit has to be enjoyment! There has been lots of research to show that learning an instrument can improve a child's cognitive abilities across all subjects. This is probably due to a number of factors, including the discipline of practice and perseverance that learning an instrument develops, increased confidence and also right-left brain co-ordination. Would your child like to learn an instrument? There are spaces available for instrument tuition from September 2022. Lessons take place at Glade during the school day in weekly sessions.


