Mental Health & Wellbeing (Article 24)

Anxiety is a normal emotion – it's one of our body's natural reactions to stress. For young people, some level of anxiety is normal as they grow up and learn to navigate the world. However, it's important that they have the tools to manage feelings of anxiety, and can tell the difference between normal emotions and more severe anxiety which is interfering with their everyday life.

Article of the Week- World Day against Child Labour (Articles 11 and 36)

Article 11 (abduction and non-return of children)

Governments must do everything they can to stop children being taken out of their own country illegally by their parents or other relatives or being prevented from returning home.

Article 36 (other forms of exploitation)

Governments must protect children from all other forms of exploitation, for example the exploitation of children for political activities, by the media or for medical research.



Learning Beyond the Classroom (Article 29)

As part of a science investigation, Year 2 looked at the hypothesis: 'Children with the longest legs jump the furthest'. They children thought about the best way to explore this. They devised a simple plan of jumping from the same starting point, looking at variables and making sure it was a fair test.
