Dear Parents and Carers,

Mental Health & Wellbeing



While staying at home due to coronavirus, parents and carers may be worried about your children's development and the effect of missing school or nursery.

We do not expect parents to act as teachers, or to provide the activities and feedback that our teachers do. Parents and carers should do their best to help children and support their learning while dealing with other demands.

The change of routine and staying at home may make this a difficult time for some children and their families. Public Health England has published guidance on how to help you look after your own mental health:

Google Classroom

Earlier on this week, we shared a guide on how to log on to Google Classroom via Parent Mail. Thank you for your patience whilst we enhance our online learning provision. You may remember, during the last lockdown, each class received two live teaching sessions a week via Zoom. With Google Classroom, children are recieving daily live teaching sessions in the morning and have work uploaded for them to do throughout the day and submit back for their teacher to mark and provide feedback. Our class teachers and LSAs are online the whole day from 8.45 am to 3.30pm.



From Monday 11th January, teachers will upload the work expected for their class daily by 8am. During the live teaching sessions (via Google Meet and / or Zoom), teachers will explain the tasks to their class and show them where the work can be found and how to submit them. We request that all worked in submitted daily by 3.30pm, at the latest so that teachers can mark them before their next session. Teachers are not expected to respond to work submitted after 4pm. Please allow children to engage in recreational activities after 3.30pm as they would have been 'on screen' the whole day.

Vulnerable children and the children of critical workers

Vulnerable children and the children of critical workers who are attending school are supervised in mixed year group bubbles where they are continuing with their online learning. As I have said before, the safest place for your child is at home. Do not consider sending your child to school if they can be looked after at home (i.e. if one parent is not a key worker or one parent is at home or working from home).

Currently, we have 2 full bubbles of children in school with a waiting list, should we open a third bubble.
