- The funding will be used to narrow and close the gap between the achievement of pupils eligible for PPF and their peers
- As far as its powers allow the school will use the additional funding to address any underlying inequalities between children eligible for Pupil Premium and others
- We will ensure that the additional funding reaches the pupils who need it most and that it makes a significant impact on their education and lives
- To aim for all KS1 pupils to make good progress by the end of KS1 and close the attainment gap of eligible pupils and their peers
- To aim for all KS2 pupils to make good progress and close the attainment gap between eligible pupils and their peers
