## Safeguarding- Everyone's Business



"Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is everyone's responsibility. Everyone who comes into contact with children and their families has a role to play."

Keeping Children Safe in Education (September 2023).

The safeguarding of children is everyone's business and schools have a responsibility under Section 175 of the Education Act 2002 to ensure that their functions are carried out with a view to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children. This includes:

- > Preventing the impairment of children's mental and physical health or development
- Protecting children from maltreatment
- > Ensuring that children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care; and
- > Taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes.
- > If anyone in our community has a concern about a child, they should do one of the following:
- > Speak to the Designated Safeguarding Lead or Deputy Designated Leads in the school.
- Contact Redbridge Children's Social Services directly at 020 8708 3885.
- Contact the Police, by ringing 101 (non-urgent) or 999 (emergency).


## **Essex Fire Museum- Open Days**

According to the Department of Education's published data, the attendance rate was 93.4% across all schools in the week commencing 8th January 2024.


Well done to **Year 4** for the highest attendance, last week! Our whole school attendance target remains 96%.
