TOWER OF LONDON

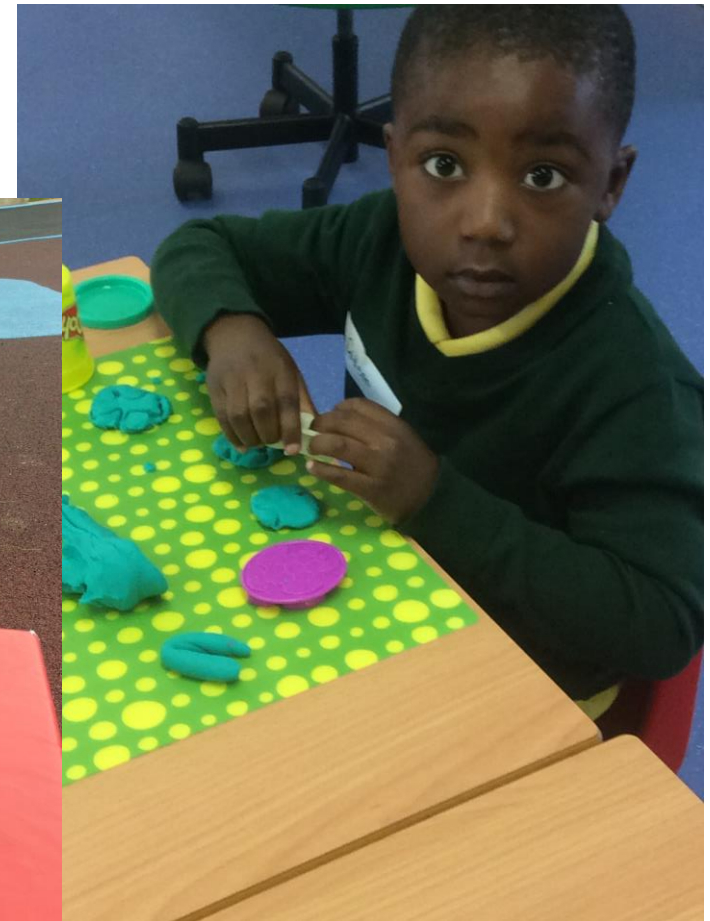
Various children across KS2 attended an art visit at the Tower of London. This is part of an ongoing project.

NURSERY - FIRST DAY

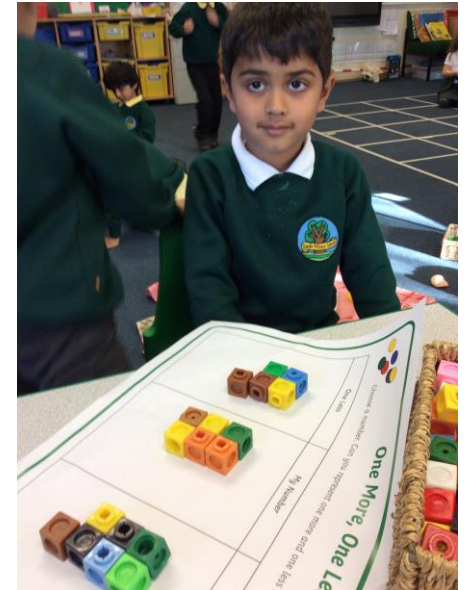
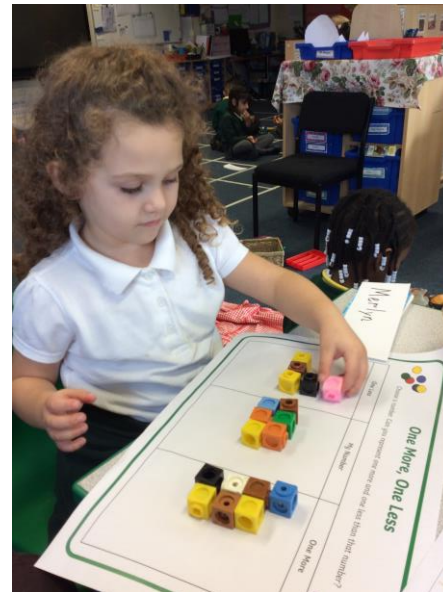
Pupils in Nursery, have started their learning journeys at Glade. They have been having fun getting to know the nursery environment. Articles 28, 29

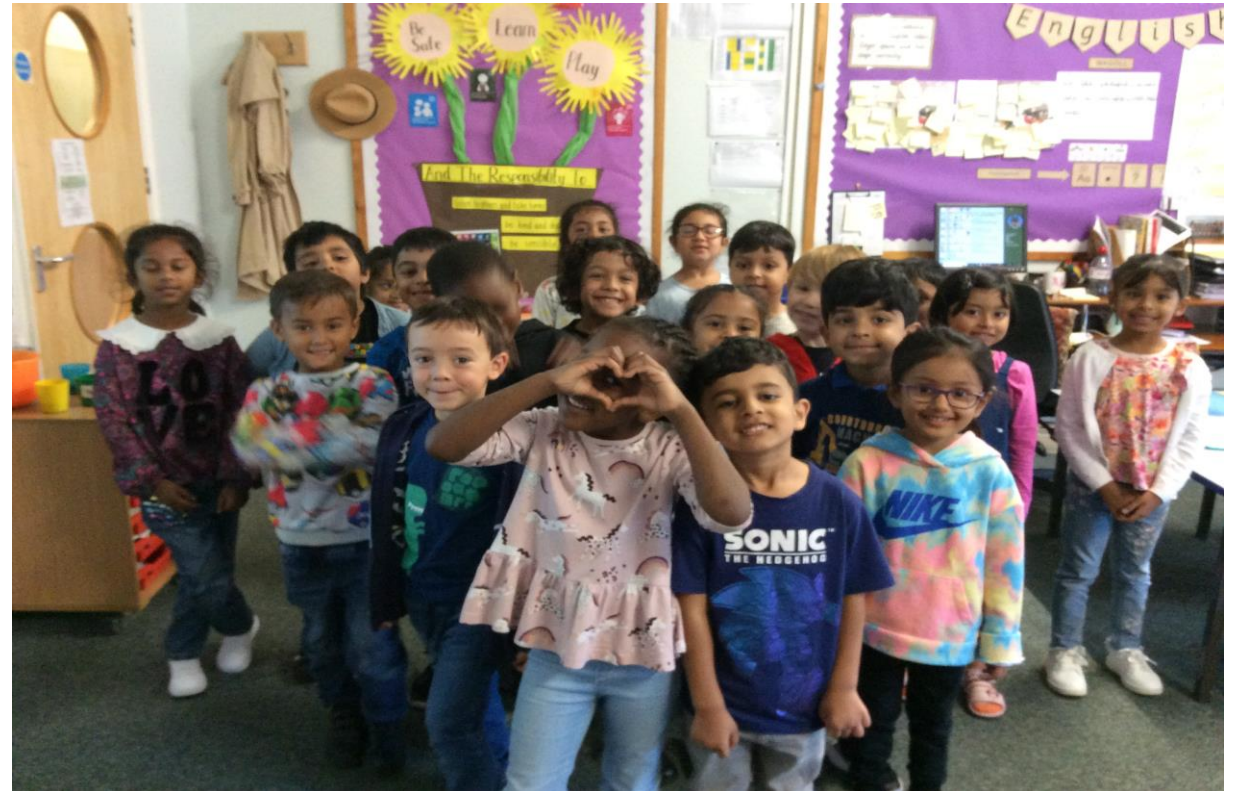


JEANS FOR GENES DAY

An assembly was held during harvest time to give children the chance to think about how we can all come together during these difficult financial time to help support each other by sharing what we have.

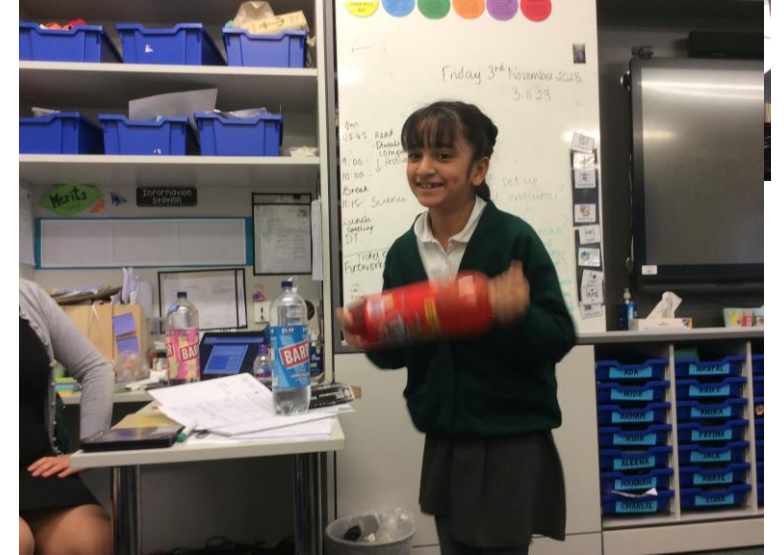
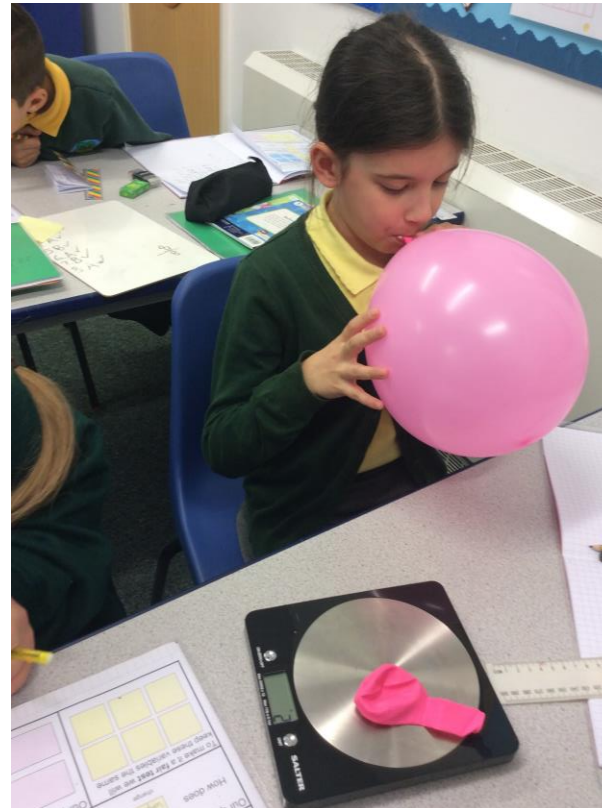

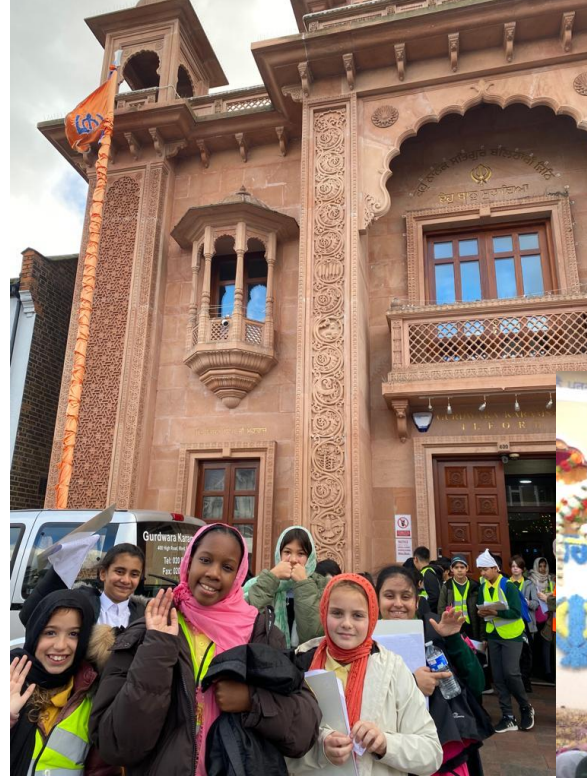
DIWALI CELEBRATIONS

YEAR 3 - POETRY WORKSHOPS

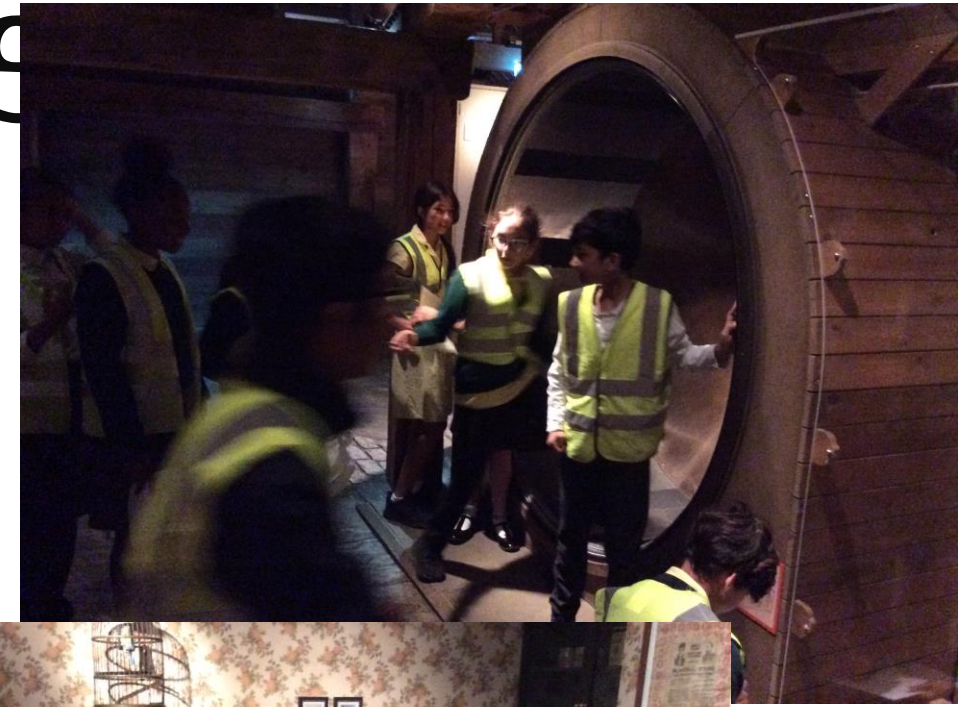

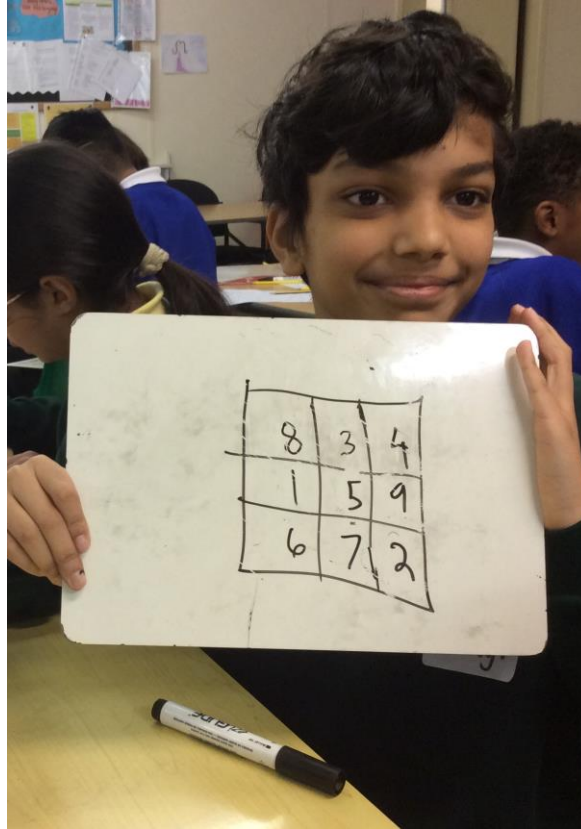
YEAR 6: DOCKLANDS MUSEUM TRIP

MORE ABLE MATHS EVENT

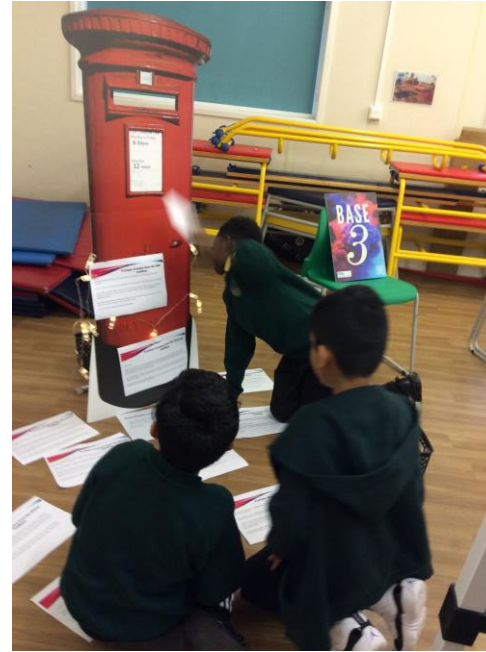

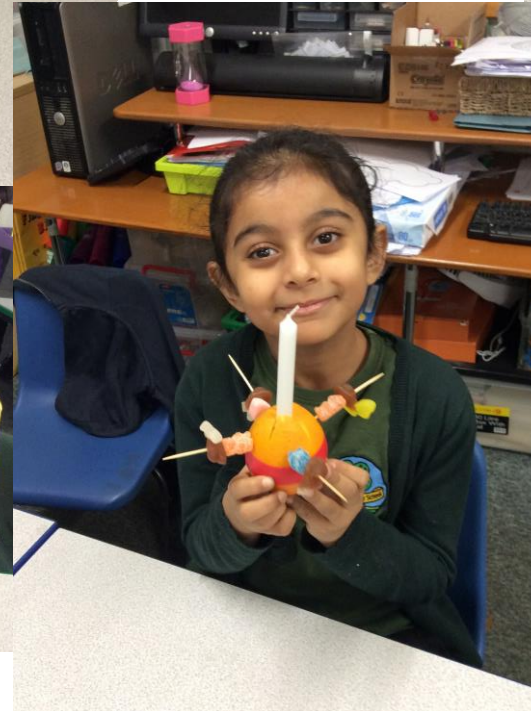
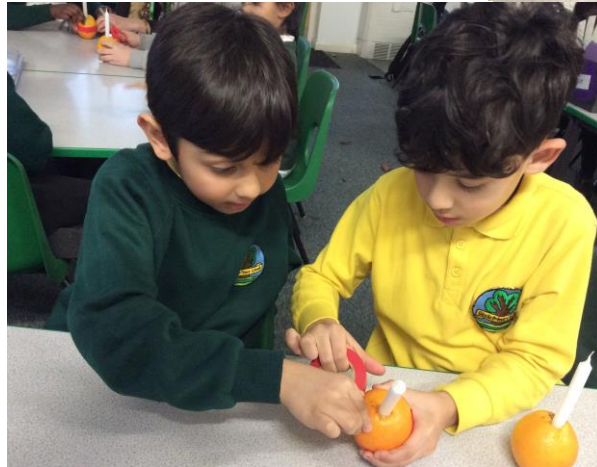
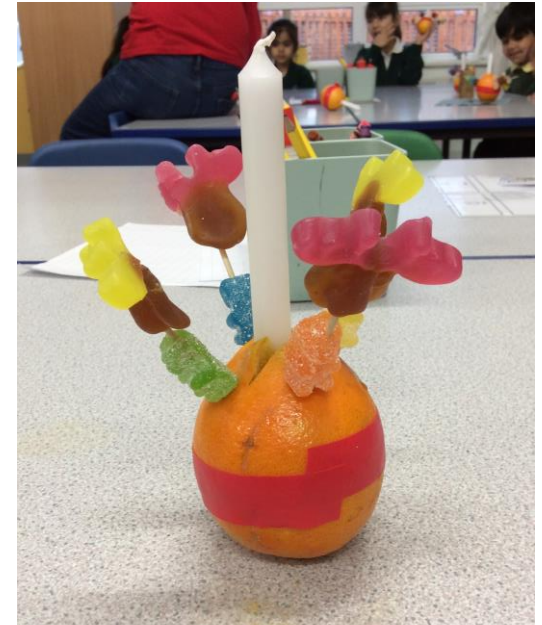
PRAAYER SPACE WORKSHOPS

KS1- CHRISTINGLE MAKING

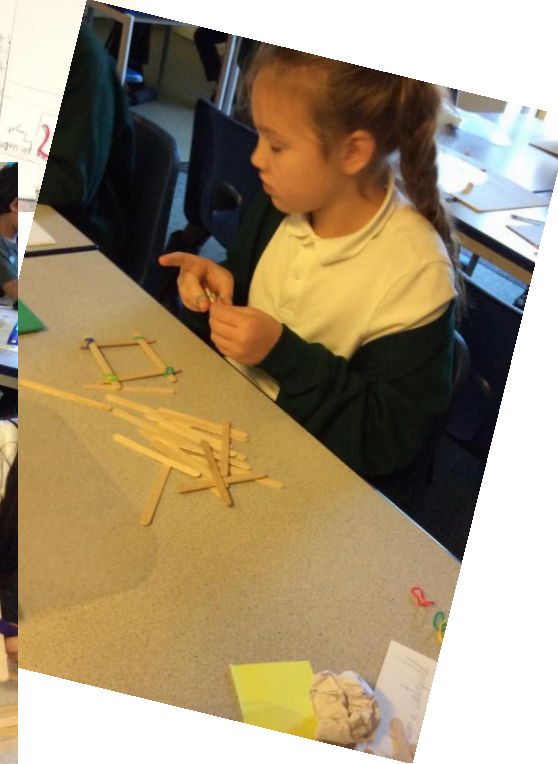
The Christian Education project came into school to talk about the period that Christians call Advent. KS1 learnt why this time is special to Christians. They also made Christingles and talked about what they represent

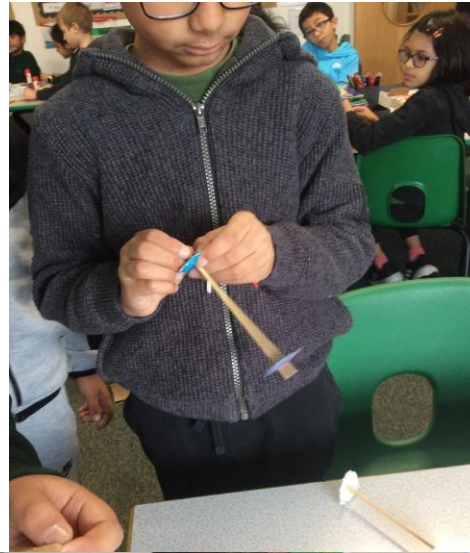
YEAR 5 MEETING CHRIS LUBBE.

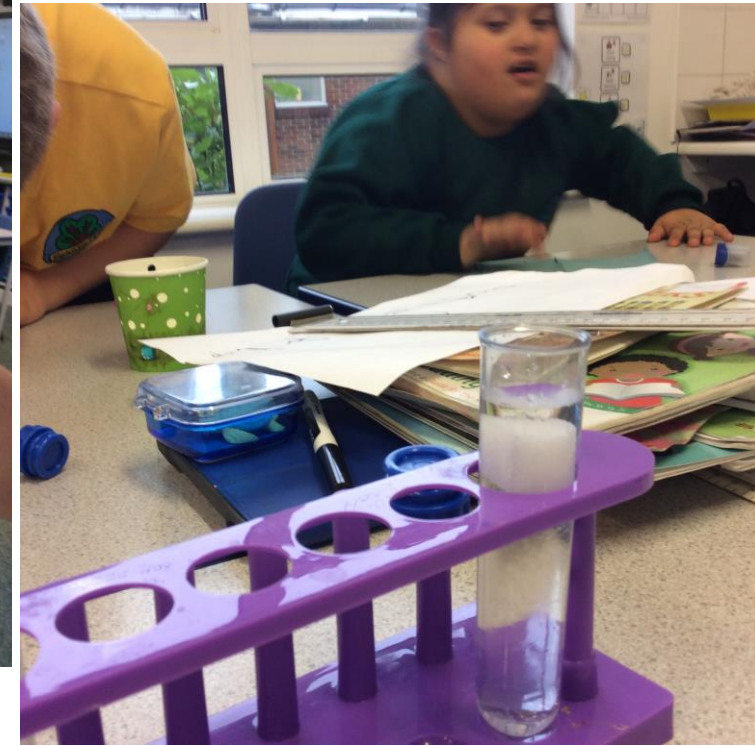
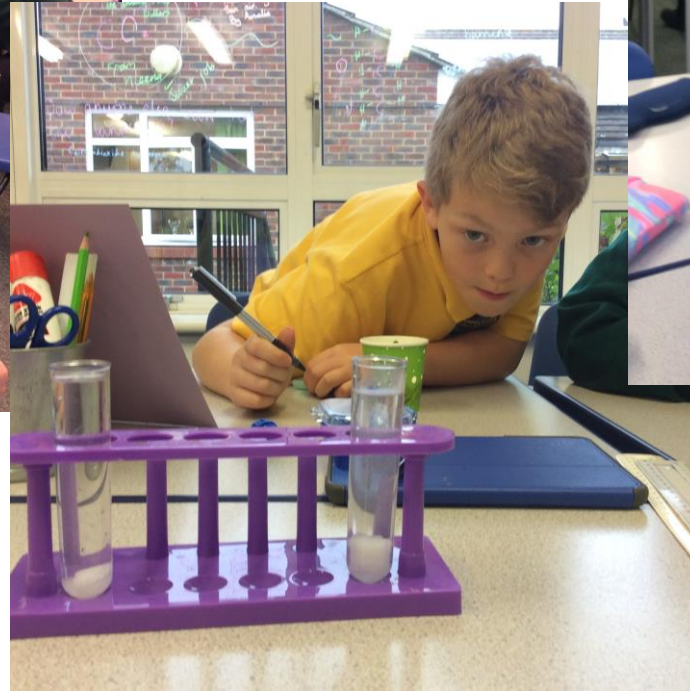
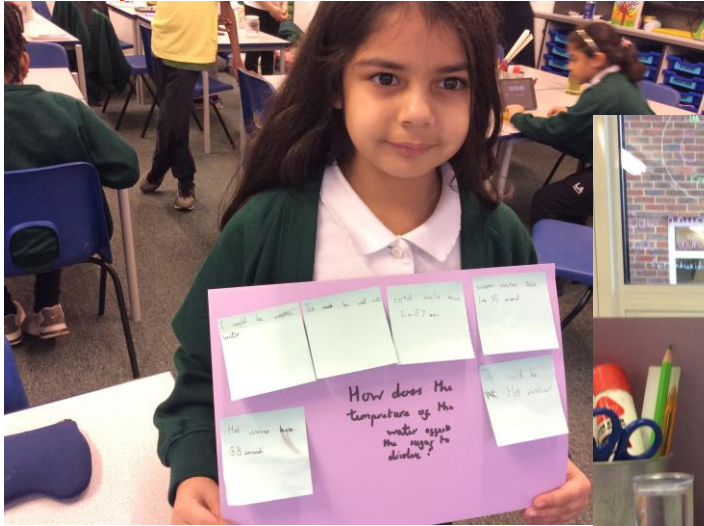


The Year 2 children explored wheels and axels before designing and creating moving vehicles.

YEAR 4 - SCIENCE INVESTIGATIONS

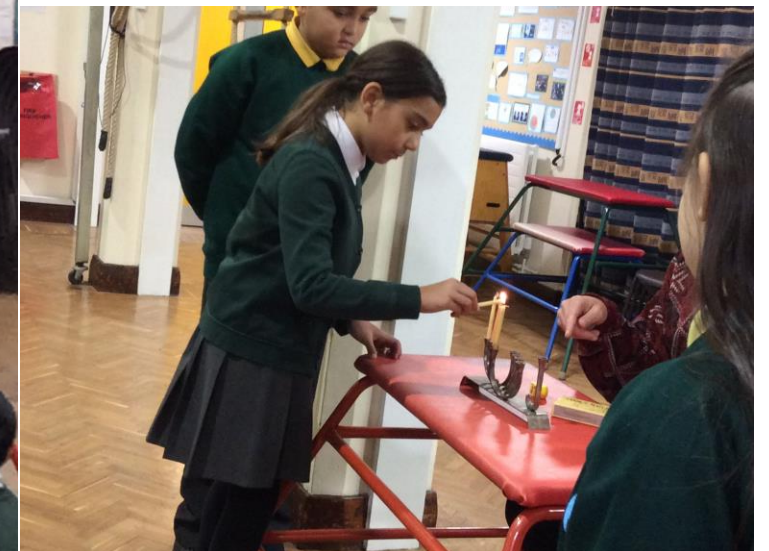

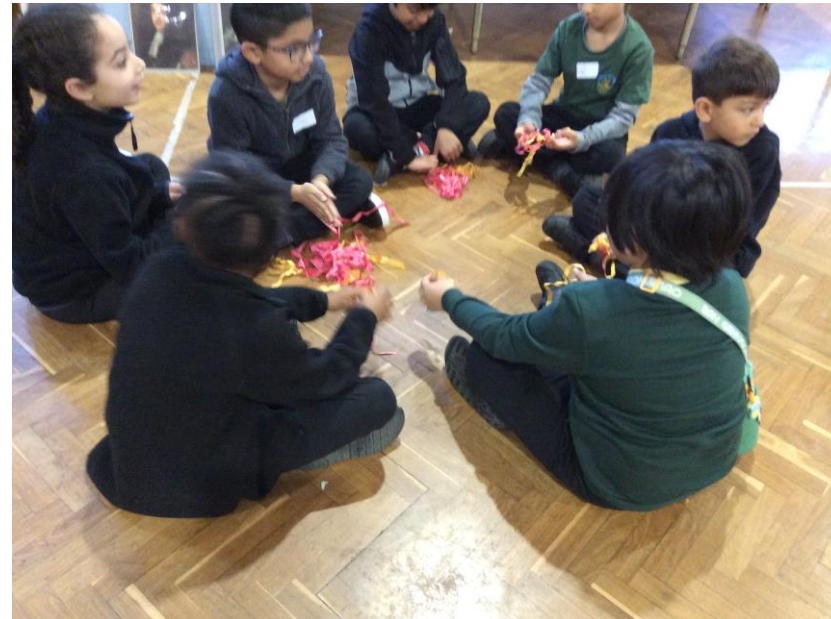
