Safeguarding

Bullying is when someone is being hurt either by words or actions on purpose, usually more than once, feels bad because of it, and has a hard time stopping what is happening to them. It can happen at any time and it can happen in any place. Bullying takes place in many types of relationships. It is behaviour that can make people feel hurt, threatened, frightened and left out and it can happen face to face and online. Bullying behaviour can harm children physically or emotionally and, although the actual behaviour might not always be repeated, the threat that it might can be sustained over time, typically by actions: looks, messages, confrontations, physical interventions, or the fear of these.



At Glade, we have a policy to help staff spot any signs of bullying and step in to stop it happening. This is also designed to prevent bullying happening in the first place. There is also a child friendly version of our anti-bullying policy created by our Article 12 group.

As with any concerns, these should first be raised with the class teacher. If this needs to be raised further, it is passed to the Phase Leader. If it requires any further escalation, it is passed to the Deputy Headteacher or Headteacher. Every child has a right to feel safe in school. 'We are a listening school, we are a telling school.' However, if children feel unable to voice a concern, they can use the Bubble Boxes which are located in classrooms and across the school.
