It is natural for parents and carers to occasionally argue with one another, but sometimes, conflict between parents or carers can increase to a level that is not healthy for the family. Conflict can also occur when parents and carers are managing stress or worries about financial issues, issues of trust and fidelity, parenting practices, or where there is stress or trauma in the family. This includes when parents or carers have decided to separate.

Stress does not just make conflict more likely, but it also makes us less able to manage conflict. When we are stressed, we are less able to think objectively and see things from another person's point of view, and more likely to react in automatic, poorly thought through ways.

Article of the Week- Human Rights Day- Articles 4 and 41

On 10th December 1948, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights was adopted by the United Nations General Assembly. This important moment in human history is now remembered on that date every year and is known as Human Rights Day. The aim of all human rights is to make people's lives better. In the Convention there are two Articles that remind us that human rights are the responsibility of the Government who must use their laws to protect rights and that rights are the minimum standard expected.

Article 4 (implementation of the Convention)

Governments must do all they can to make sure every child can enjoy their rights by creating systems and passing laws that promote and protect children's rights.

Article 41 (respect for higher national standards)

If a country has laws and standards that go further than the present Convention, then the country must keep these laws.

Year 1 Toy-making Workshop

Year 1 had a wonderful time last week, looking at and playing with toys from long ago. They also had an opportunity to make an old-fashioned toy out of wood using tools and other equipment. The children loved the toys that they had created and couldn't wait to take them home to share with their families.
