


GLADE @ A GLANCE Spring 2023




#### YEAR 2 - DESIGNING MOVING VEHICLES


The year 2 classes looked at different ways they could make vehicles and then worked on DT problem solving skills as they tried to get them to move more efficiently.

## YEAR 6 ARK THEATRE




Year 6 enjoyed historical learning through the Ark Theatre workshops which highlighted aspects of life during WWII in Britain




#### YEAR 2 - SCIENCE MICRO HABITATS






YEAR 3 -SCIENCE






#### YEAR 1-GEOGRAPHY








#### YEAR 4- GEOGRAPHY










## JONNY WALKER WORKSHOPS -




#### YEAR 1 - VALENTINES MANSION TRIP
