Mental Health & Wellbeing- Article 24



With the sad passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth 11, and all the media coverage, it will have been obvious to your children that something sad and significant has happened. Children are inquisitive individuals and love to ask questions and really understand what is going on. For some children, this may be the first time they hear the words 'death' or 'died'. They may hear things on the radio and television, in school or across their social media channels, which could prompt a lot of questions and curiosity from children, wanting to know what it all means. Unfortunately, for some children they will have already experienced a bereavement and this significant event could bring up their own difficult feelings.

If you know a child who has been bereaved or is impacted by The Queen's death, Winston's Wish provides support for grieving children, young people (up to 25) and adults supporting them. Call them on Freephone Helpline on 08088 020 021 (open 8am-8pm, Monday to Friday).

Safeguarding

Every member of the Glade community has responsibility for ensuring the safety and well-being of every child at all times. Staff receive safeguarding training on a regular basis through annual Level 1 training sessions and regular updates throughout the year. All members of the Safeguarding team receive regular Level 3 training. Regular volunteers and visitors will also receive safeguarding training.

All staff have a duty of care and are expected to be proactive with reporting matters around child protection, including concerns/suspensions around radicalisation, female genital mutilation, and online safety. If you have a concern about a child or another adult, please speak to one of the members of staff of the safeguarding team.

Article of the Week- Articles 1, 4 and 41

As a Gold Rights Respecting School, children's rights are embedded throughout our curriculum. Each week, children explore a different article. This Article of the Week will support children to explore these rights in more detail and consider what must be done to make rights happen for all children.



EXPLORING ARTICLES 1, 4 & 41

How do children get to enjoy their rights in the UK? What does Government do to make this happen?

Have a think and write down some answers.



Article 1 makes clear that everyone under the age of 18 has all the rights in the Convention.
Article 4 states that governments must do all they can to make sure every child can enjoy their rights by creating systems and passing laws that promote and protect children's rights.
Article 41 states that if a country has laws and standards that go further than the present Convention, then the country must keep these laws.

Picture News- Article 17

Through the weekly Picture News assembly, children learn about our world, develop independence, resilience, respect and unlock their own drive and passion for learning. The weekly Picture News is shared on our website:

Please spend some time asking your child about what they have learnt and discussed during their Picture News session. Each week, there is a link to British Values and the UN rights of a child. In the story this week, children learnt that a housing association has built Europe's first virtually plastic-free housing development in the UK, consisting of 12 affordable one-bedroom homes built using plastic-free alternatives.

This week's question asks children: 'Could we live our lives without plastic?'
