Through the weekly Picture News assembly, children learn about our world, develop independence, resilience, respect and unlock their own drive and passion for learning. The weekly Picture News is shared on our website: https://www.glade.redbridge.sch.uk/newspictures

Please spend some time asking your child about what they have learnt and discussed during their Picture News session. Each week, there is a link to British Values and the UN rights of a child. In the story this week, children learnt that 13-year-old Max Woosey - also known as the 'Boy in the Tent' - has recently set a Guinness World Record for the most money raised by camping, after spending three years sleeping in tents.

This week's question asks children: 'What is the best way to show your support?'



Article of the Week- World Day against Child Labour (Articles 32 and 35)

Article 32 Child labour – Governments must protect children from economic exploitation and work that is dangerous or might harm their health, development or education. Governments must set a minimum age for children to work and ensure that work conditions are safe and appropriate.

Article 35 Prevention of sale and trafficking -Governments must protect children from being abducted, sold or moved illegally to a different place in or outside their country for the purpose of exploitation.



Poetry Retreat

Last week, 36 children across KS2 went on a residential to the New Forest for the Poetry Retreat, led by Jonny Walker and accompanied by Mrs Hussain, Mrs Jones and Mrs Jain. This was our school's second Poetry Retreat. Poetry Retreats are empowering visits to sites of natural beauty where all children and adults can throw themselves into four days of expressive, immersive writing.

Throughout the week, children explored a huge range of poetic forms whilst learning to think poetically, and mould their thoughts and feelings into words. They created and performed poetry with concrete and abstract themes, on stage, in Burley Village Hall. On Thursday, we had David Fisher, a Forest School teacher and the Director of 'Rooted Learning', teaching us about different uses of mushrooms, den building and rafting.



Learning Beyond the Classroom

On Tuesday, 13th June, six children from Years 4 and 5 attended an exciting event called the A.I.M High Maths Day with three other schools.

The children were engaged in a series of stimulating and enriching activities that further developed their mathematical abilities.
